A: Hairs Galore,

If you think you're tired of it, imagine your dog who is losing all of that precious fur! Shedding is perfectly normal, and not your dog's fault at all. They have no control over how much they shed. You know who does have control though? Their human owner!

The most effective way to prevent shedding is to brush your dog regularly. Shedding is a product of dead hair that naturally falls out. By brushing them on a regular basis, you catch and remove the loose fur before it falls out. Brushing has so many other benefits too. If you want your dog to have softer, cleaner coat that doesn't shed, I'd suggest you get to brushing!

Brushing your dog's fur can get a little more complicated than that so try and keep up. Depending on the dog, they may need a different type of brush-or multiple types-to help to maintain their luscious locks. You'll need to do some research on your own to find out the best brush for your pampered pup.

If you still have excess dog hair, I would try being diligent in your, ahem, cleaning habits. Thorough vacuuming and furniture covers can take your home from overwhelmingly hairy to the sanctuary you desire.
